







Multisectoral development policies and strategies mostly highlight the importance of good nutrition and have a multisectoral nutrition lens






Education sector policies and strategies focus on relevant nutrition actions to varying degrees with the ECD policy and school feeding policy the most comprehensive



• The National Health and Social Welfare Policy recognises that malnutrition is an important issue and is linked to the 2008 National Nutritional Policy. Sensitization efforts are needed to ensure that this Policy is updated to include nutrition objectives and nutrition indicators in line with the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy by 2021.

Stream 2

Efforts should be made to ensure that the National Health and Social Welfare Policy is updated to be in line with the policy priority areas relevant for the health sector outlined in the revised National Nutrition Policy





Implications for Food and Agriculture Policy and Strategy



Stream 1

 The Food and Agriculture Policy and Strategy is more than 10 years old. Sensitization efforts are needed to encourage the Ministry of Agriculture to update the Policy in line with the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy – specifically in terms of nutrition sensitive agriculture interventions and improving household food security as well as related objectives and indicators.

Stream 2

The Food and Agriculture Policy and Strategy does not currently include many of the relevant CNAs which could be included. There may also be other key intervention areas in line with the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy which should be included.

Implications for National Food Security and Nutrition Strategy



Stream 1

 The National Food Security and Nutrition Strategy is more than 10 years old.
 Sensitization efforts are needed to encourage the Ministry of Agriculture to update the Policy in line with the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy – specifically in terms of strategies to improve household food security as well as related objectives and indicators.

Stream 2

Only about two thirds of the relevant CNAs related to this Strategy are currently included. There may also be other key intervention areas in line with the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy which should be included. Therefore there is broad scope to increase the nutrition sensitivity of this Strategy.

Stream 1

 At present the National Policy and Response Strategy on Climate Change does not include any specific focus on nutrition. Sensitization efforts are needed to encourage the Environmental Protection Agency to recognise the links between malnutrition and climate change and include nutrition objectives and nutrition indicators in the policy in relation to climate change.

Stream 2

None out of twelve identified CNAs are included in the National Policy and Response Strategy on Climate Change. Therefore, there is broad scope to include key identified CNAs and nutritionrelevant intervention areas in the Policy and Strategy in line with the Priority areas outlined in the revised National Nutrition Policy.

Implications for National Inter-Sectoral Policy on Early Childhood Development



Stream 1

 The National Inter-Sectoral Policy on Early Childhood Development already focuses on many linkages with health and nutrition activities and includes some nutrition-relevant indicators. However sensitization efforts should take place with the Ministries involved in order to review the Policy in light of the updated 2019 National Nutrition Policy.

Stream 2

There are a number of identified CNAs which could be implemented through or in partnership with ECD programs, but which are not currently. These include linking with interventions related to acute malnutrition, provision of MNP, and providing information on healthy diets and good nutrition for example.





Implications for National Gender Policy



Stream 1

 At present the National Gender Policy does not include any specific focus on nutrition although it does seek to promote girls primary education which is one of the CNAs. Sensitization efforts are needed to encourage the Ministry of Gender and Development to recognise the links between malnutrition and gender and include gender-sensitive nutrition objectives, indicators and actions in the policy.

Stream 2


Only one out of five identified CNAs is included in the National Gender Policy and not specifically in relation to nutrition. There is scope to include other identified CNAs and nutrition-relevant intervention areas in the Policy in line with the revised National Nutrition Policy.


















Main findings & implications of the Plan Overview






Stream 1

• The National Health and Social Welfare Plan recognises that malnutrition is an important issue and is linked to the 2008 National Nutritional Policy. Sensitization efforts are needed to ensure that this Policy is updated to include nutrition objectives, indicators and activities in line with the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy by 2021.

Stream 2

Efforts should be made to ensure that the National Health and Social Welfare Plan is updated to include identified CNAs such as multiple micronutrient powder and supplementary feeding in emergencies as well as other priority interventions relevant for the health sector outlined in the revised National Nutrition Policy.

Policies selected for further analysis based on key sectors identified in Liberia which are currently focusing more on nutrition: Health, food security/agriculture, education and gender.







Stream 1

 The Liberian Agricultural Sector Investment Plan II (LASIP II) links with the Food Security and Nutrition Strategy, the Food and Agriculture Policy and Strategy, the National Nutrition Policy 2008 and the first LASIP 2010-2015. Advocacy efforts are needed with the Ministry of Agriculture to ensure that it is updated to reflect the agricultural priorities of the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy and related nutrition objectives and indicators.

Stream 2

The LASIP II currently focuses on a marketbased approach to agriculture and food security and therefore does not focus on agriculture and food security focused CNAs at all. The Plan should be reviewed to be brought more in line with the CNAs and the revised National Nutrition Policy where possible within its broad objectives.

Implications for Getting to Best Education Sector Plan




Stream 1

 The Getting to Best Education Sector Plan recognises link between learning outcomes and health and nutritional status and focuses on some nutrition-relevant activities. However advocacy efforts are needed to review whether the Plan is in line with the revised 2019 National Nutrition Policy in terms of nutrition objectives and indicators in the education sector.

Stream 2

The Getting to Best Education Sector Plan broadly includes a high number of the relevant CNAs but others such as school gardens are omitted. There may also be further scope for a broader range of nutrition relevant activities in line with the revised National Nutrition Policy and this should be looked at.

Policies selected for further analysis based on key sectors identified in Liberia which are currently focusing more on nutrition: Health, food security/agriculture, education and gender.










