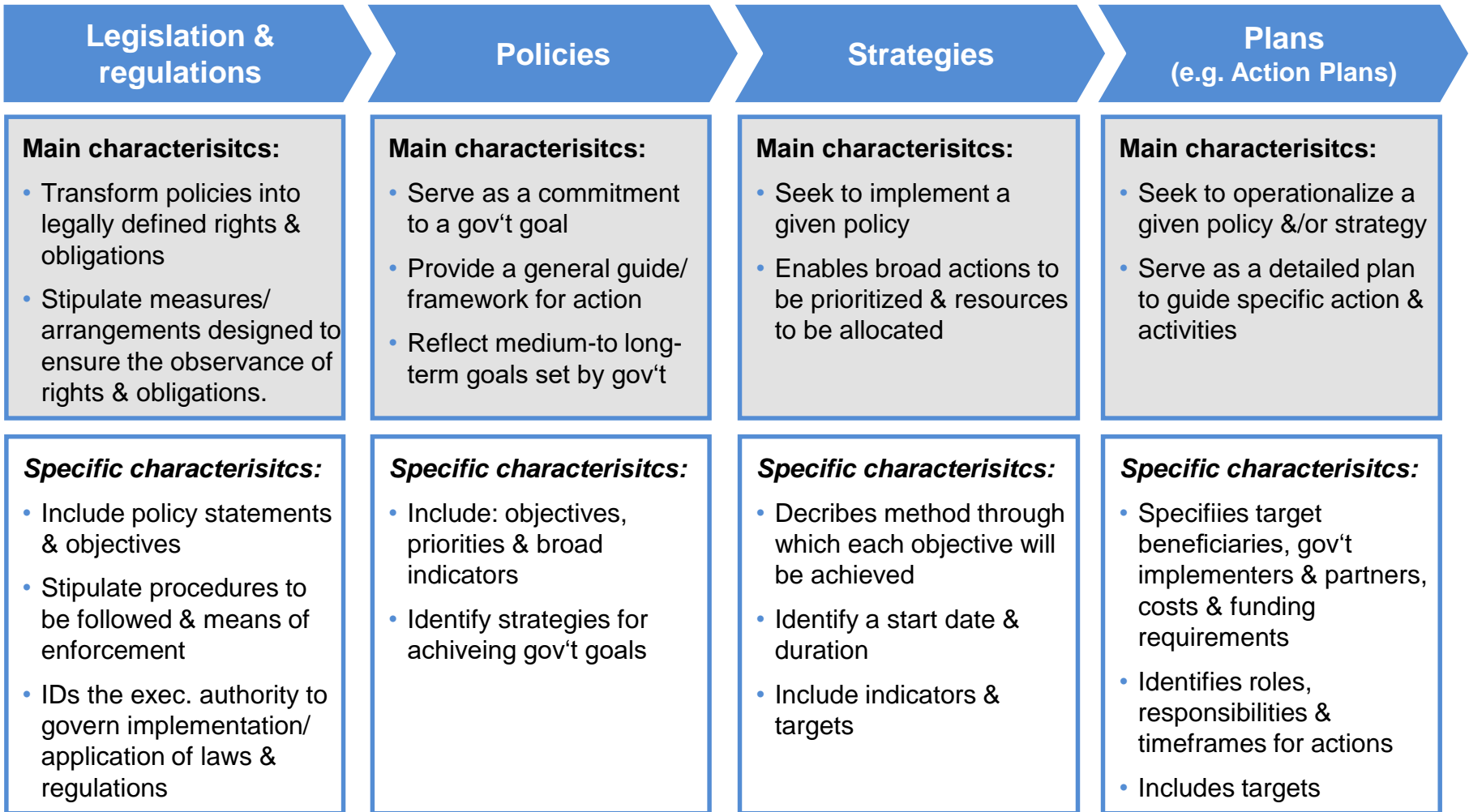

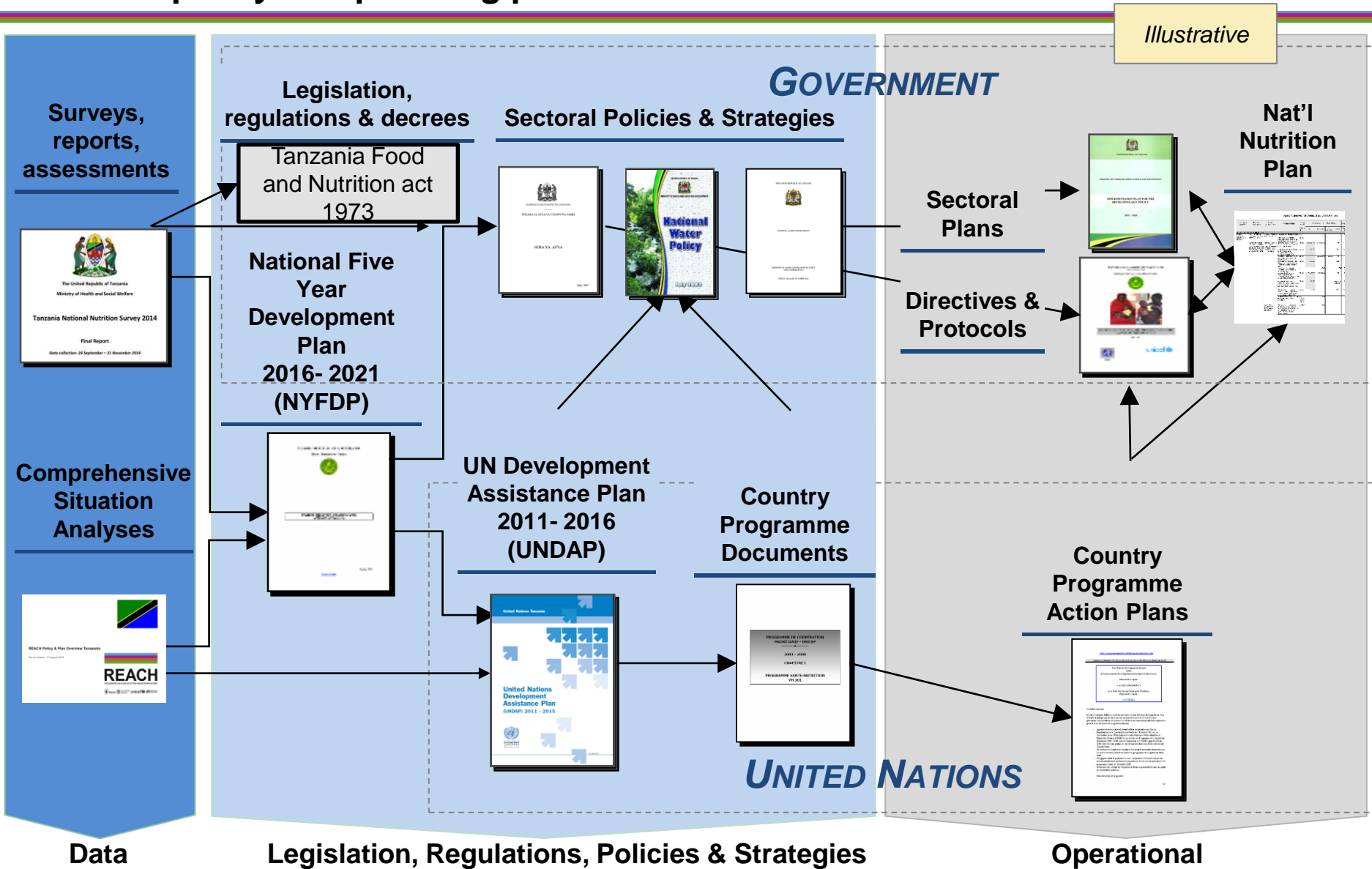


Making the distinction between legal/regulatory, policy, strategy and planning frameworks



Ideally, the relationships with other relevant frameworks should be identified to foster a coherent approach to nutrition

Methodology: Applying the nutrition lens to the policy & strategy frameworks

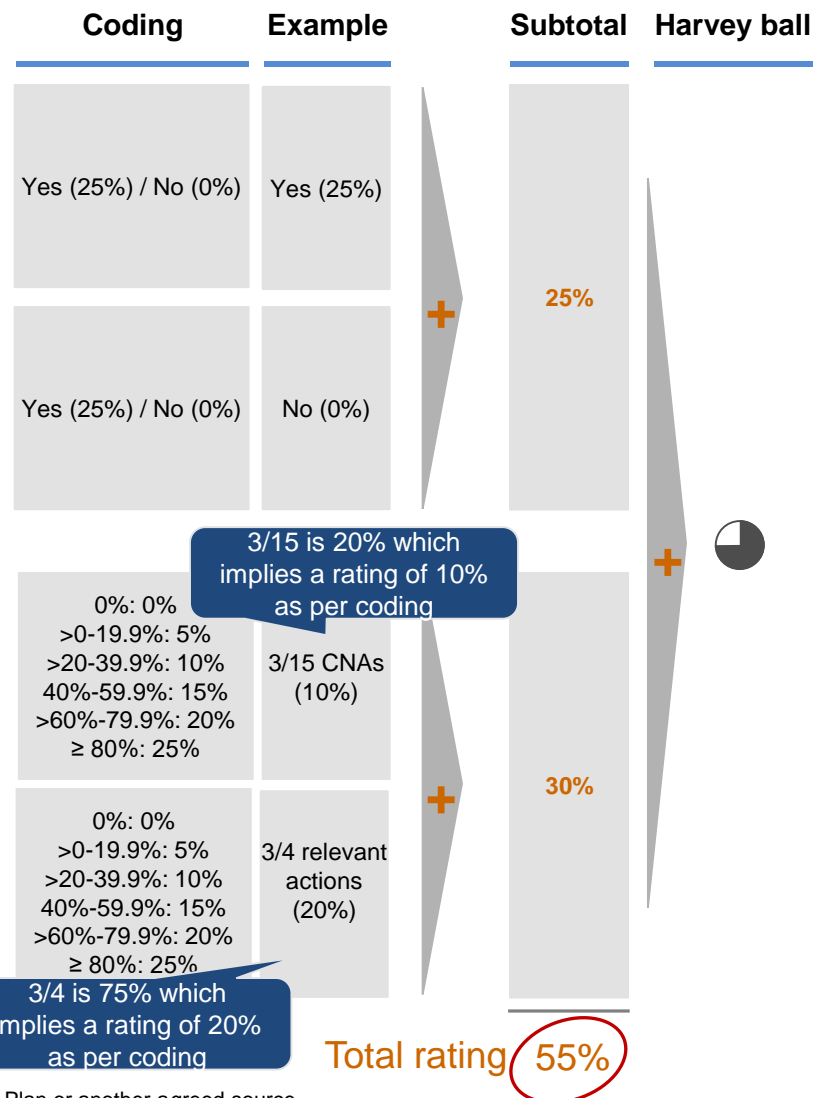
Two streams of standardised criteria established to ascertain the extent to which nutrition is covered by policy and strategy frameworks

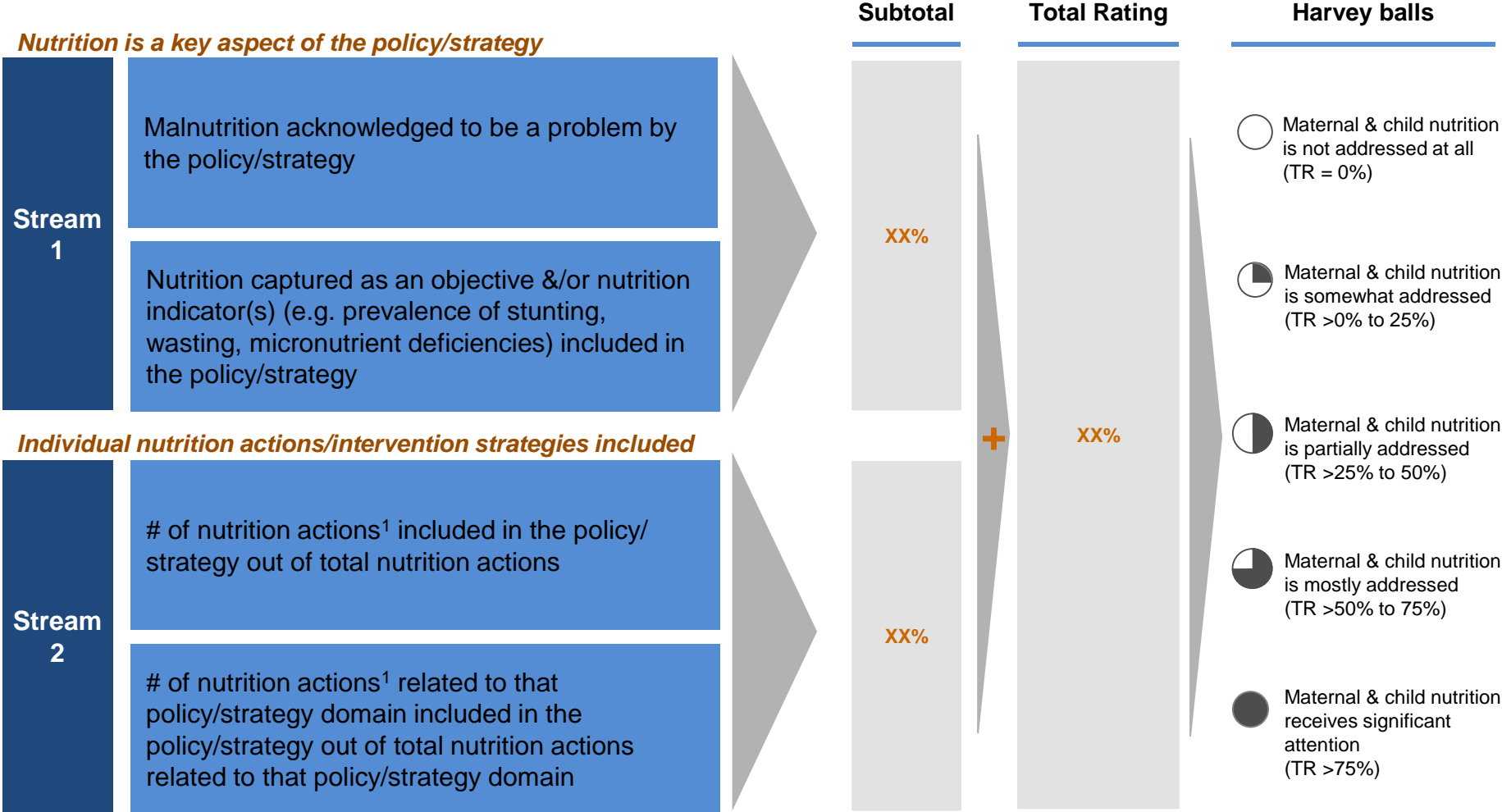



Stream 1

- The National Trade Policy does not acknowledge nutrition as an issue or include it as an objective to be addressed, so all mention of nutrition actions are indirect.
- Advocacy efforts should be made to include nutrition in the cross-cutting issues section in the next policy, so that the document acknowledges nutrition as an issue and sets it as an objective to be addressed

Stream 2

- Advocacy efforts should be made to include actions which affect the accessibility of micronutrient supplements, deworming tablets, malaria nets, and family planning supplies, as well as nutrition governance actions.
- Technical guidance should be offered to better understand the ways that nutrition issues may be addressed by the Trade Policy

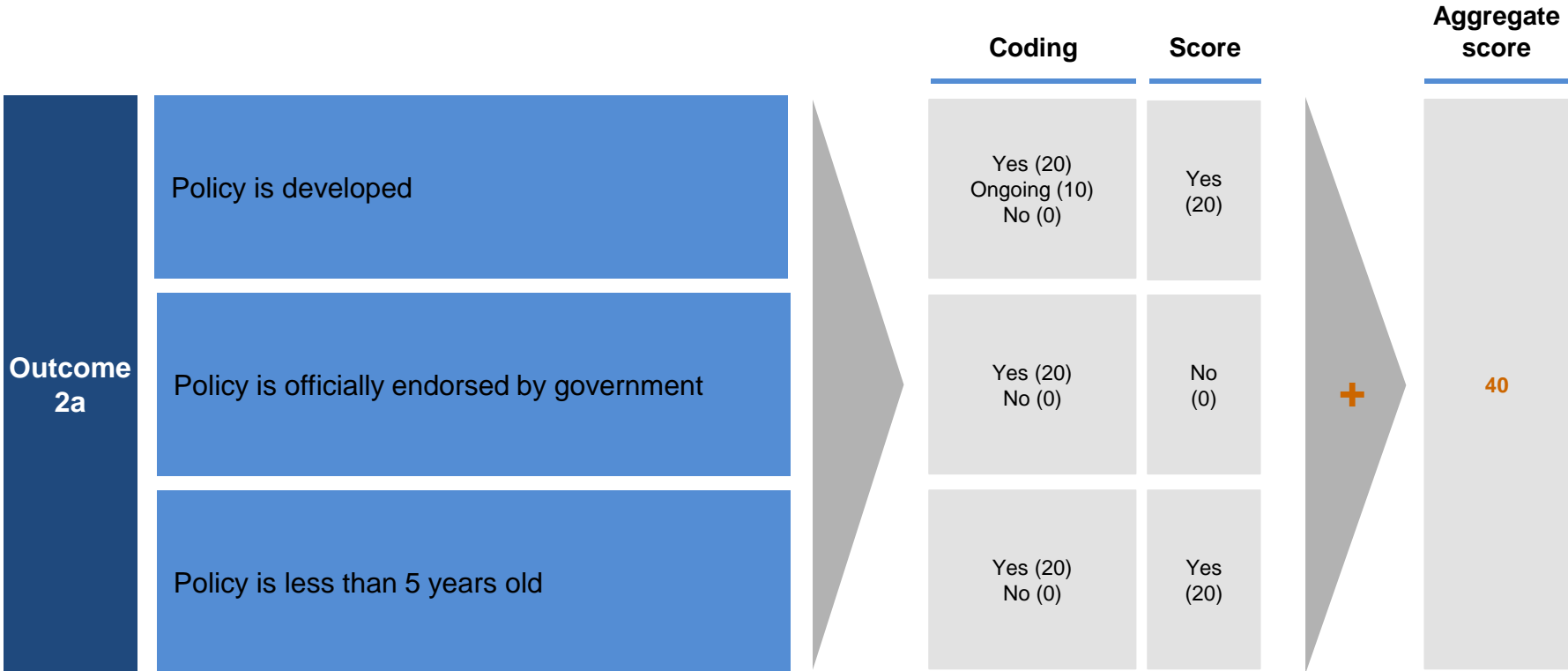

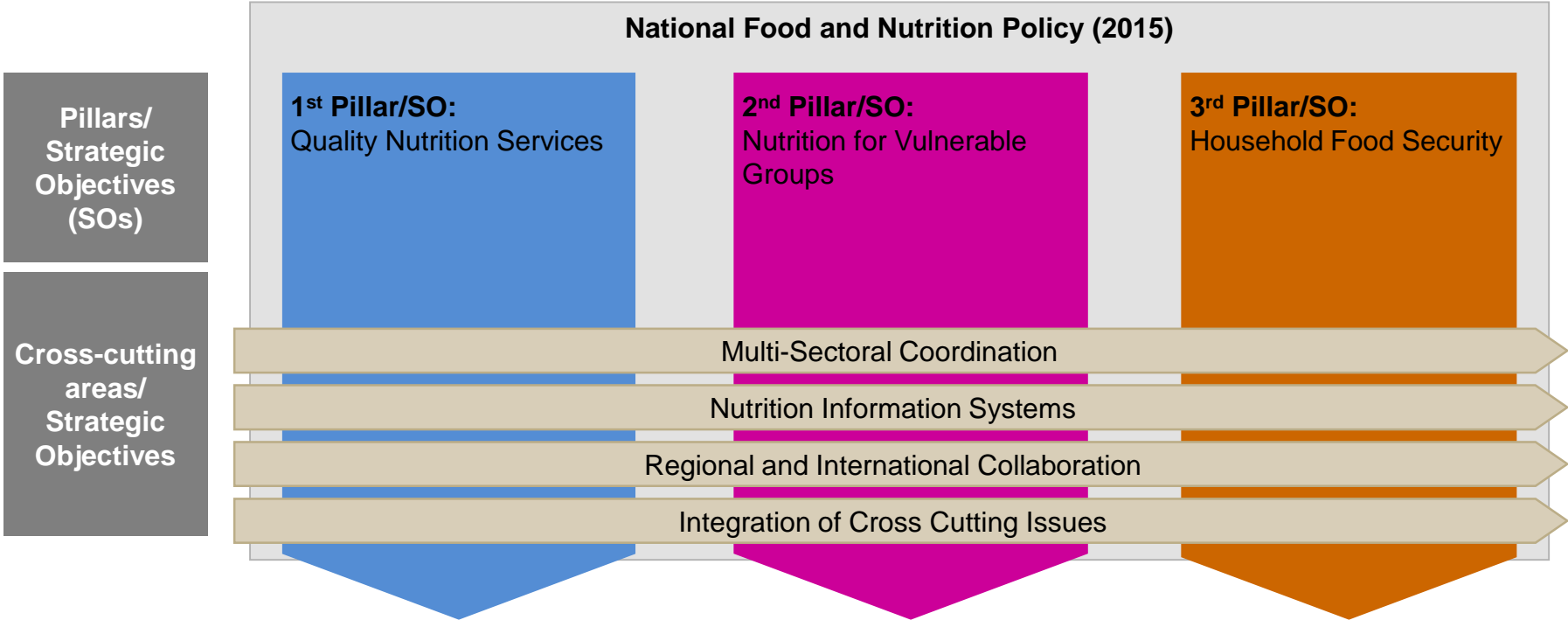

Assessing the state of the National Food and Nutrition Policy, using the REACH M&E Framework

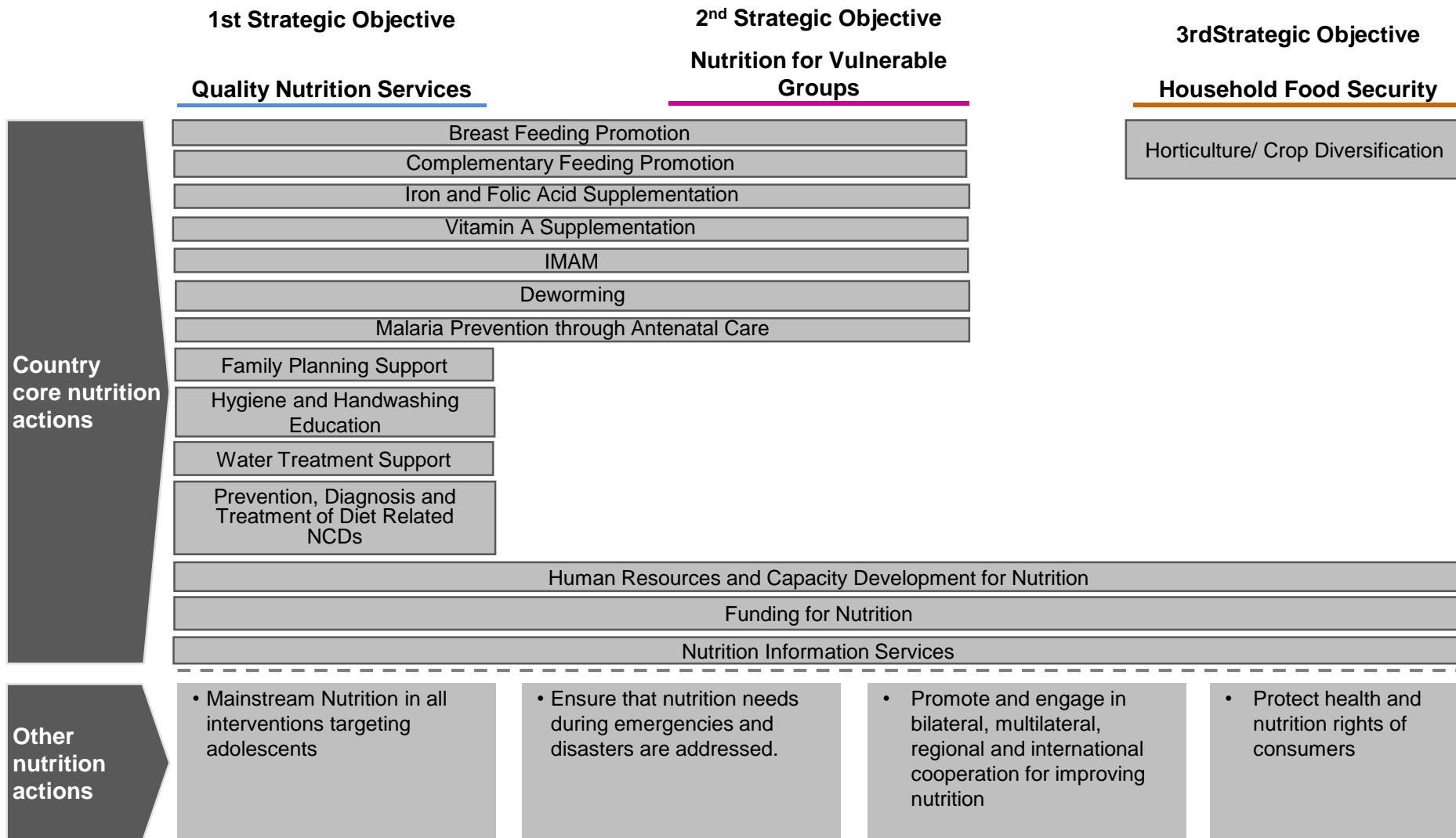


National Food and Nutrition Policy has 3 strategic objectives and 4 cross-cutting areas and a new draft is currently under review



Nutrition governance (including multi-sectoral coordination) is acknowledged as a key area by the policy

Country core nutrition actions are distributed across the 3 strategic objectives of the National Food and Nutrition Policy though most are concentrated in the 1st strategic objective on Quality Nutrition Services



The National Food and Nutrition Policy includes most of the core nutrition actions stipulated by the Nat'l Nutrition Action Plan though further efforts are needed to integrate remaining core nutrition actions

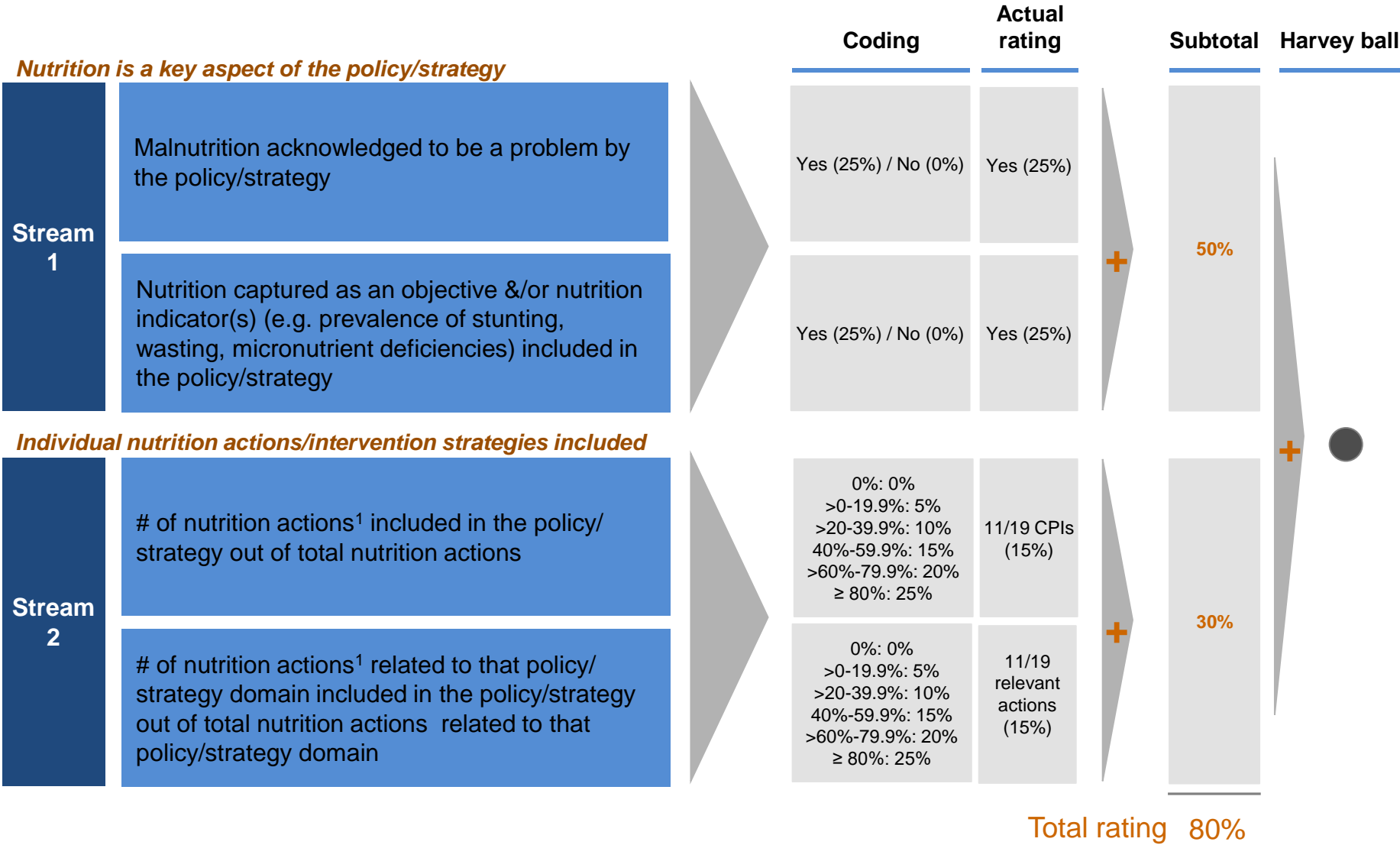
